Expands to support NAS FALLON personnel and their families

OPERATION FEED BACK



For many people in Northern Nevada, the economic times have become difficult, and have left many without sufficient resources to meet their food needs. “Operation Feed Back” has been started by Hands of Hope Food Bank to help alleviate this situation. The program is open to Veterans, Active Duty, Guard and Reserve plus their immediate families. Operation Feed Back provides support on Tuesday night in Reno, but is now expanding to Fallon on Thursday evening, and delivering food at the Churchill County Fairgrounds.

This is not a sit down meal, but an opportunity to load up on bread, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, protein and other staples. For most of the participants that come to the event, it is a major change from most food pantries where they are given canned food and dry goods. **Volunteers are needed to come into our facility in Reno on Thursdays to help prepare for the delivery later in the day.**

Another unique aspect of Operation Feed Back in Fallon is that all funding for it comes from a Shared Maintenance Fee of \$5 per family and a \$5 delivery fee that participants prepay. The \$10 total covers the operational costs of the program. This is definitely NOT another entitlement program supported by tax dollars.
